

## ESM 5: Storytelling form

The purpose of this Storytelling Guide is for sharing how and the extent to which your participation in the study group has created value for you and for your classroom practices. The guide is composed of five sections:

# I. Activity

Describe meaningful study group activities you participated in and your experience of it (e.g., a conversation, a problem/task) in the last semester. What specific insights you gained.

# II. Output

Describe specific resources the study group activities produced for you (e.g., student thinking, ideas, information). Why you thought they might be useful.

# III. Application

Tell, how and the extent to which you used these resources in your teaching practice throughout the semester. What they enabled that would not have happened otherwise.

## IV. Outcome

Personal: Explain if and how the study group affected your success (e.g., student thinking/strategies, professional learning, teaching).

*Organisational*: Has your participation contributed to the success/goals of your school.

# V. New definition of success
